

The Institute for Interdisciplinary Legal Studies at the University of Lucerne is currently inviting applications for its Visiting Fellows programme for 2019.

The scheme is intended to accommodate promising junior researchers (PhD students and postdocs) who wish to spend a period of time at the institute pursuing work on a particular topic. During their stay, fellows enjoy access to our specialist resources, and are invited to share and develop their ideas via participation in lectures, seminars, colloquia and conferences.

The fellowships provide a grant to cover travel and accommodation costs (up to a designated maximum), with the possibility of an additional stipend to defray supplementary living expenses. The standard period of tenure is between four and eight weeks.

We encourage applications from eligible candidates undertaking work that crosses traditional boundaries between law, the humanities and the social sciences. Preference may be given, however, to submissions that fall within the institute's current main areas of research. These include:

- Law, Media and Technology
- Law and Economics
- Histories of Law and Justice
- Urban Legal History
- Law, Arts and Humanities
- Theories and Histories of Intellectual Property Rights
- Law and Biomedicine
- Law and Sustainability

Please also note that the institute will be hosting the [World Congress of the International Association for the Philosophy of Law and Social Philosophy](#) in July 2019. We are happy to consider applications for fellowships that coincide with the timing of the congress.
